The annual prayer service commemorates the millions of lives lost to abortion and the many women and men wounded by the abortion experience. We invite you to join in thanking God for the gift of life and praying for an end to abortion.

Archbishop John C. Nienstedt will speak. Providence Academy students will provide the music. A collection will be taken for the Archdiocesan LIFE FUND, a fund that provides last resort, emergency financial aid to women and couple for pregnancy-related expenses and to those with babies in their first year of life. 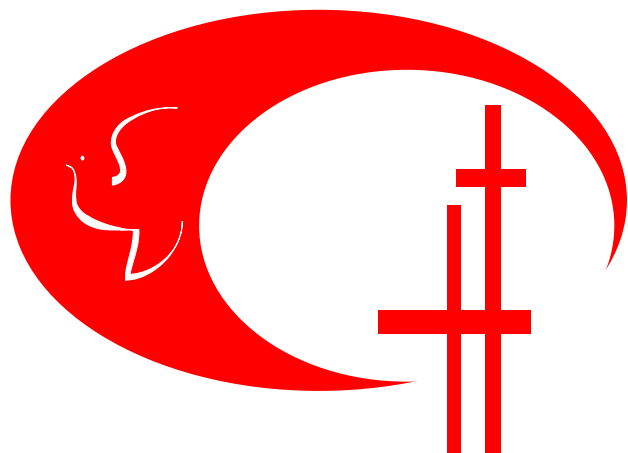

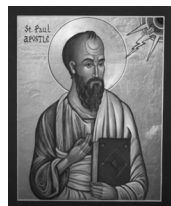
